## SPOTLIGHT

Resident Kelby Maher, DO and fourth year medical student, Carolyn Keiper, implemented an injury prevention program in their community. Inspired by their infant daughters, Dr. Maher and Ms. Keiper put together a questionnaire and administered it at 17 local pediatric clinics to determine their needs with regard to injury prevention. They asked each clinic to select two of the six programs developed by the Injury Free Coalition for Kids (IFCK) to assist in improving child health. These programs included: "Safe at Home", "Car Seat Safety", "Bike and Helmet Safety", "Teen RIDE", and "Gun Safety". In conjunction with the clinics over the last five months, this project has coordinated 3 car seat checkpoints, 2 bike rodeos, 1 Teen RIDE, and have provided 75 home safety kits with trigger locks to families.
