# Grants and Projects Database

- Easy to use
- You don't have to reinvent the wheel-
  - Members Only Channel has contact info
  - Search by topic and find out how others have dealt with an issue
- Programs can be effective advocates-
  - Provides real life examples
  - Site visits with legislators
  - Help identify other partners

## Grant/Project Search

This database archives previously funded grant projects in the Department of Community Pediatrics, including the CATCH Program, the Healthy Tomorrows Partnership for Children Program, and the Reaching Children: Building Systems of Care SCHIP Outreach Program. The database is searchable by seven major categories: target population, health topic, state/territory, project activity, AAP program, AAP district, and project year. By searching this database through the [Members Only Channel](#), you can obtain contact information of the grantees.
