

"Educational Materials Grant from the British Medical Association and BMJ"

The British Medical Association's International Department runs the BMA/BMJ Information Fund which

considers requests for health information from organizations in developing countries and other areas of need. The fund does not grant money but makes donations of educational materials, such as books, CD-ROMs and videos. We are limited by a budget of £30,000 but we are inviting applications from medical schools, medical libraries, health care institutions, health NGOs and similar organizations. Please note that we are unable to consider requests from individuals.

The BMA is now working with two suppliers to donate the books - Teaching Aids at Low Cost (TALC) and Blackwell. If you would like your organization to be considered for a donation from the Fund, please complete in full the application form which can be downloaded from the BMA's website.
