

American Academy of Pediatrics Section on Urology Specialty Fellow Membership

The membership of the [Section on Urology](#) shall consist of [Specialty Fellows](#) of the Academy who are actively involved in some aspect in the study of urology in infants, children, or adolescents, and who are interested in contributing toward the objectives of the Section. To apply as a [Specialty Fellow](#), you must be able to meet and check off each of the following member criteria:

- Advanced training in pediatric urology consisting of a fellowship of at least one year's duration. For those applicants entering a fellowship after July 1, 1997, the fellowship must be accredited by the ACGME or approved by the Training, Education, and Evaluation Committee of the Canadian Urological Association adhering to the criteria and periodic review process as defined by the ACGME.
- Documentation of certification in general urology by the American Board of Urology or the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.
- A minimum of 75% of the applicant's workweek must be spent in the care of children with urologic diseases. This work can include teaching, research, and administration.
- Residence in a single locale for 18 months prior to application.

If you meet the approve criteria, please proceed. If you do not meet any of the [Specialty Fellow](#) criteria, please apply for membership as a Section Affiliate (see [Affiliate Membership PDF](#) for descriptions and application forms).

Applicants must submit:

- [Completed Specialty Fellow application](#)
- A 12-month surgical case log, signed by a Department/Division Chairperson, listing all cases (both adult and pediatric) in which the applicant acted as either the primary or responsible surgeon. Seventy-five percent of the procedures must have been performed in children and/or teenagers, and be exclusive of such minor surgeries as urethral meatotomy, circumcision, cystoscopy, and urethral dilation. - Photocopy of a certificate, or a letter from the fellowship program director, documenting your completion of advanced training in pediatric urology consisting of a fellowship of at least one year's duration. For those applicants entering a fellowship after July 1, 1997, the fellowship must be accredited by the ACGME or approved by the Training, Education, and Evaluation Committee of the Canadian Urological Association
- Photocopy of your certificate of board certification by the American Board of Urology
