

## **Timeline & Summary of AAP Grants, Scholarships & Awards**

The AAP offers many grants and awards to residents. Below is a complete listing of those opportunities with the month they are due, a short description and a link to find them on the YoungPeds Network.

### **JANUARY**

#### **[CATCH Resident Implementation Funds:](#)**

The Community Access to Child Health (CATCH) Resident Funds program supports pediatric residents in the planning of community-based child health initiatives. Grants of up to \$3,000 are awarded twice each year on a competitive basis for pediatric residents to address the needs of children in their communities. CATCH Resident Funds grant projects must include planning activities or demonstrate prior planning activities and may include some implementation activities.

### **FEBRUARY**

#### **[Resident Research Grant:](#)**

\$2,000 research grants are awarded to resident members to initiate and complete research projects related to their professional interests. Grant recipients also receive a \$1000 travel stipend to present their results at a professional meeting of their choice.

#### **[Resident Scholarships:](#)**

\$1,000 to \$5,000 scholarships are awarded to resident members based on financial need/hardship. The selection is based on the assessment of the resident's application and the accompanying Program Director's Recommendation Form.

### **MARCH**

#### **[Resident International Elective Award:](#)**

\$500 grants awarded to resident members who wish to complete a clinical pediatric elective in the developing world during their residency. Awards are given solely on the basis of the application and the accompanying Program Director's Recommendation Form. The awards will be chosen within two cycles, due September 15 and March 15.

## **APRIL**

### **Resident Section Clinical Case Presentations:**

Ten resident-selected clinical case abstracts that focus on relatively unique diagnostic and/or therapeutic characteristics and with significant educational value that is generalizable. Selected abstracts will be displayed as posters at the National Convention and Exhibition and recipients will be awarded free one-day registration covered by the Section on Medical Students, Residents and Fellowship Trainees (SOMSRFT).

## **JULY:**

### **CATCH Resident *Planning* Funds:**

The Community Access to Child Health (CATCH) Resident Funds program supports pediatric residents in the planning of community-based child health initiatives. CATCH Resident Funds grant projects must include planning activities or demonstrate prior planning activities and may include some implementation activities.

### **Anne E Dyson Child Advocacy Award:**

\$300 award for a resident-sponsored and/or resident led project that seeks to advocate on behalf of children. Winners receive a \$300 check to advance the winning projects' goals, along with travel and lodging expenses to attend the AAP National Conference and Exposition (NCE) and receive the Advocacy Award plaque during the SOMSRFT meeting.
