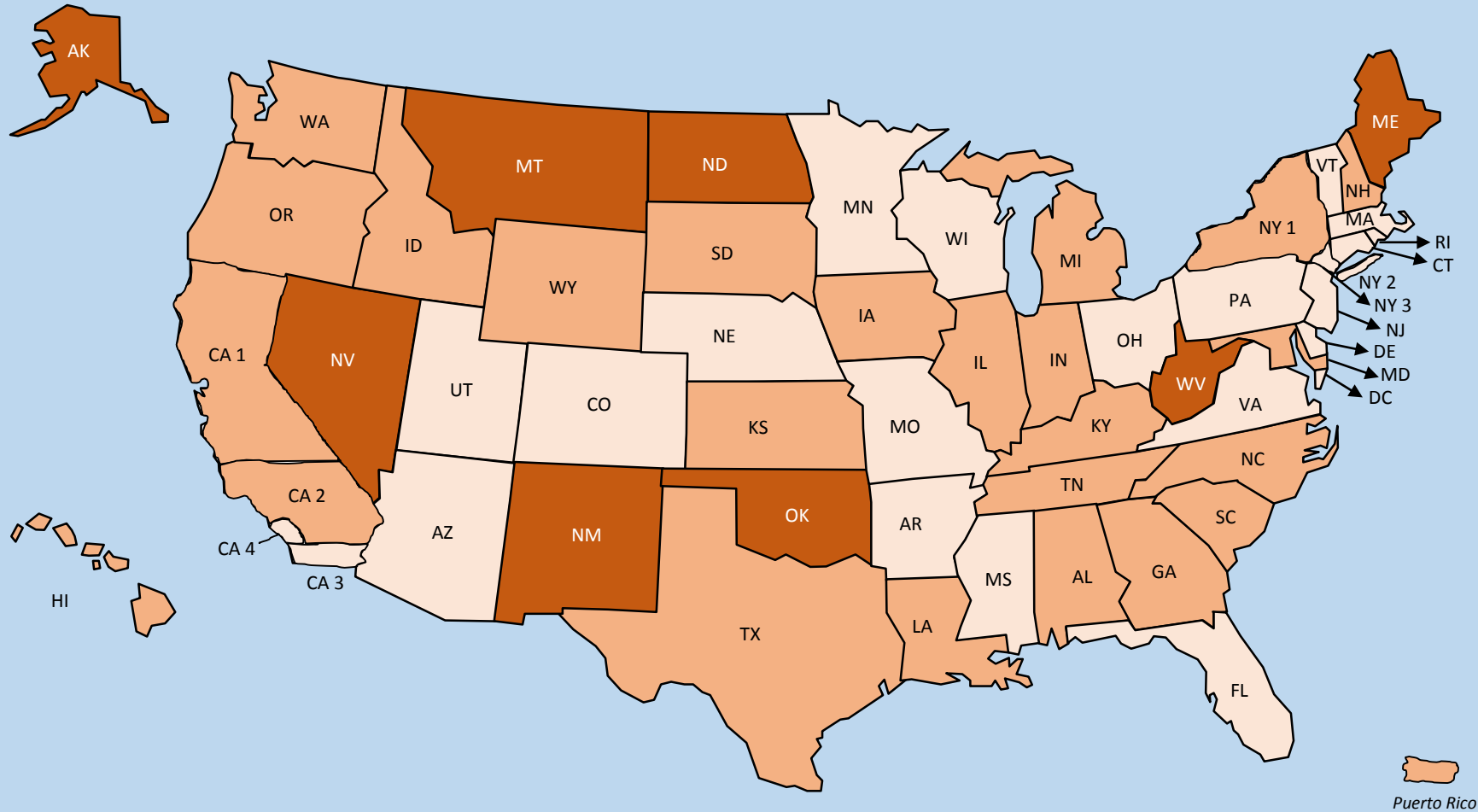

Percentage of Pediatricians Reporting that the Number of Specialists Who Care for Children in Their Area is Poor to Fair

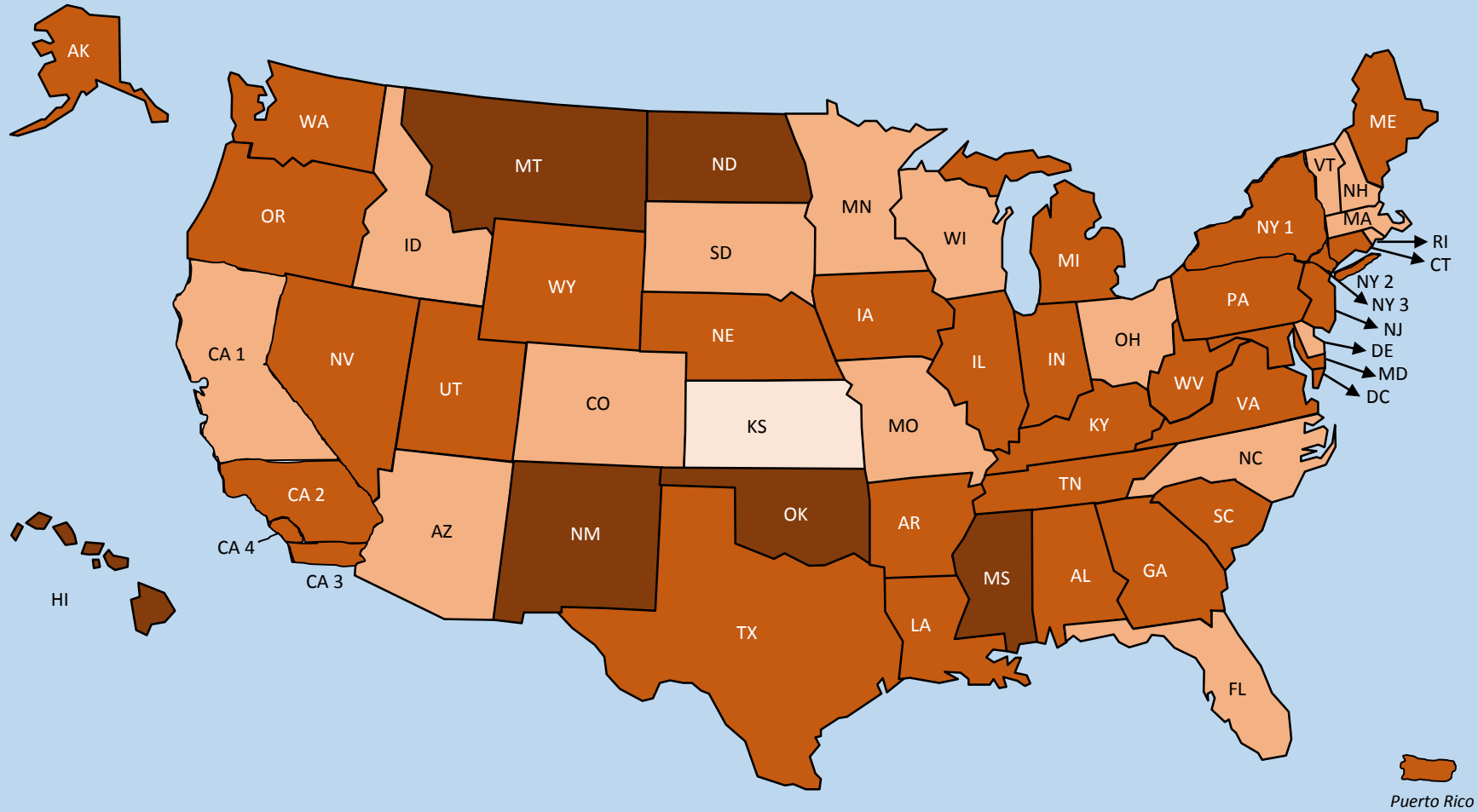

Percentage of Pediatricians Reporting that Wait Times for Appointments for Specialists are Poor to Fair



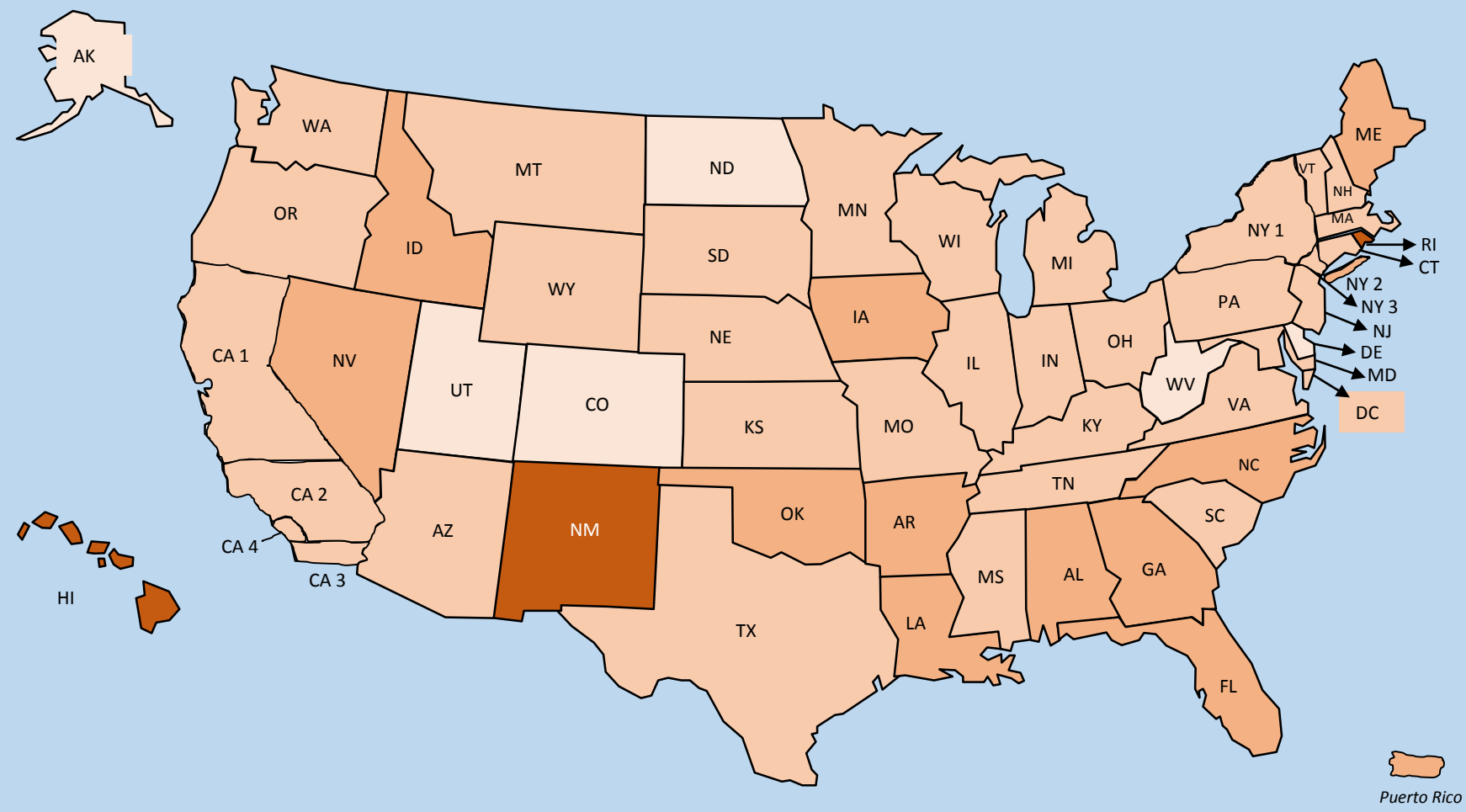

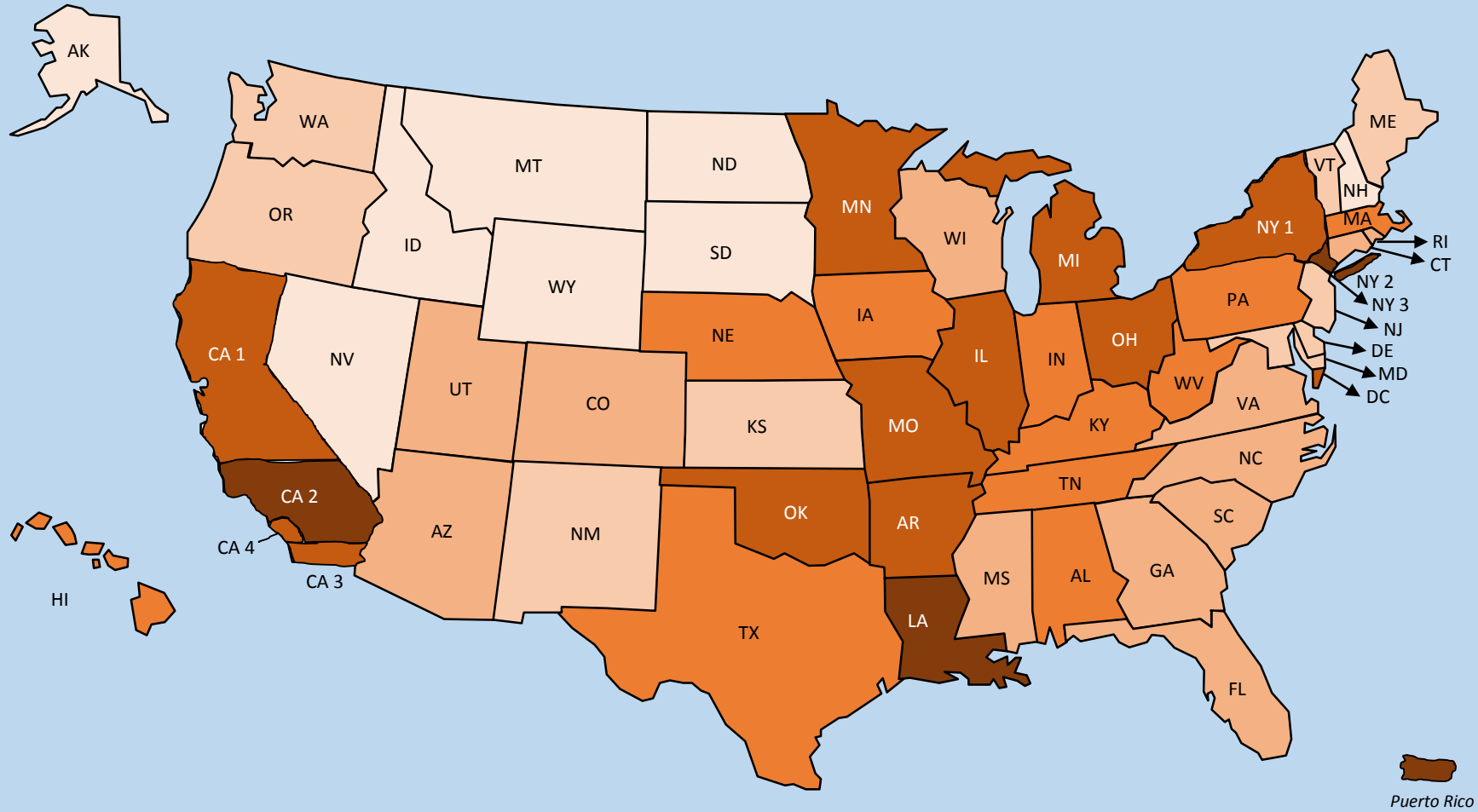

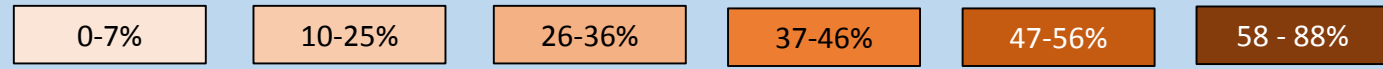
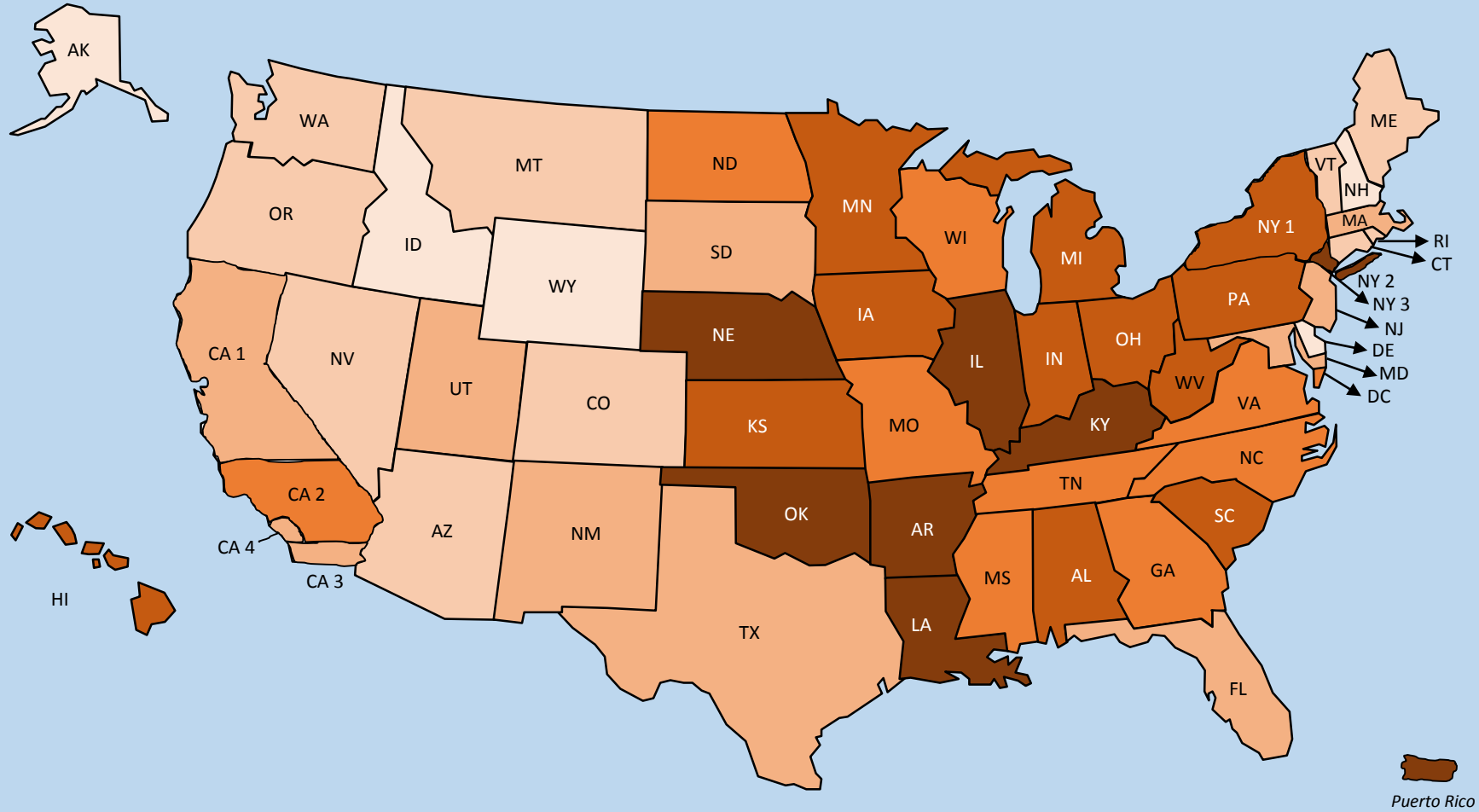

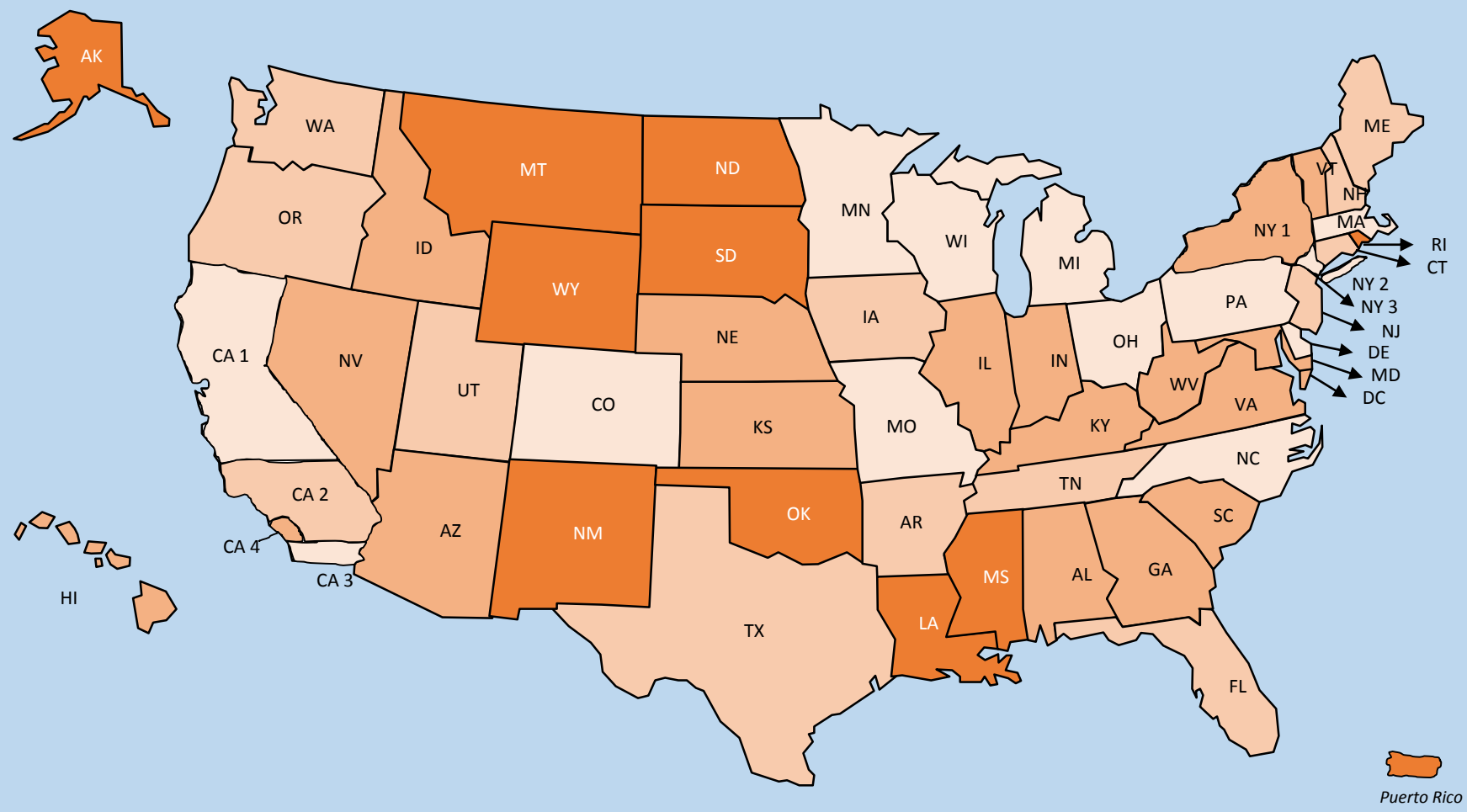

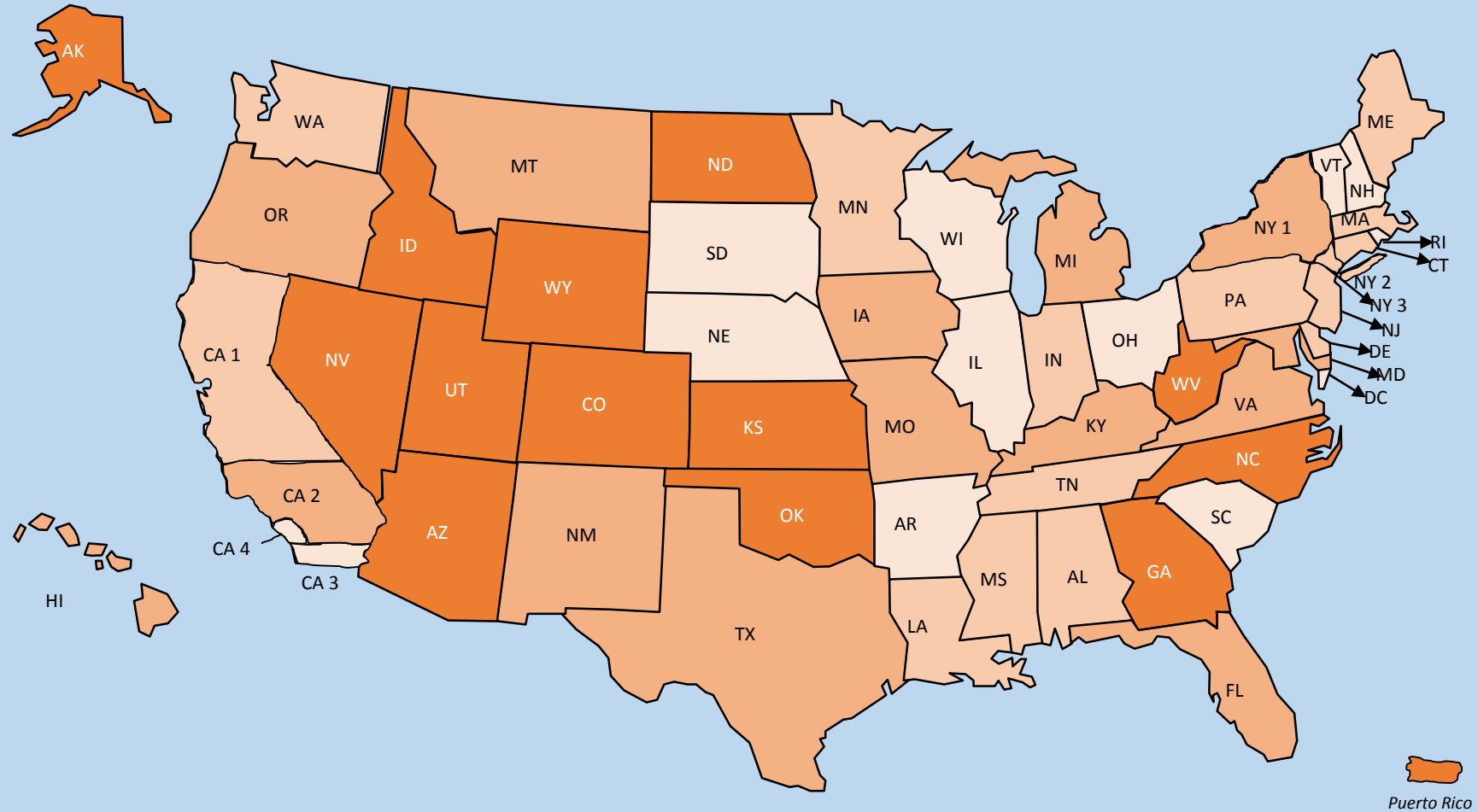
Percentage of Pediatricians Currently Practicing in the State Where They Completed Medical School

Difficulty in Obtaining a Genetics Appointment/Consultation in a Timely Manner



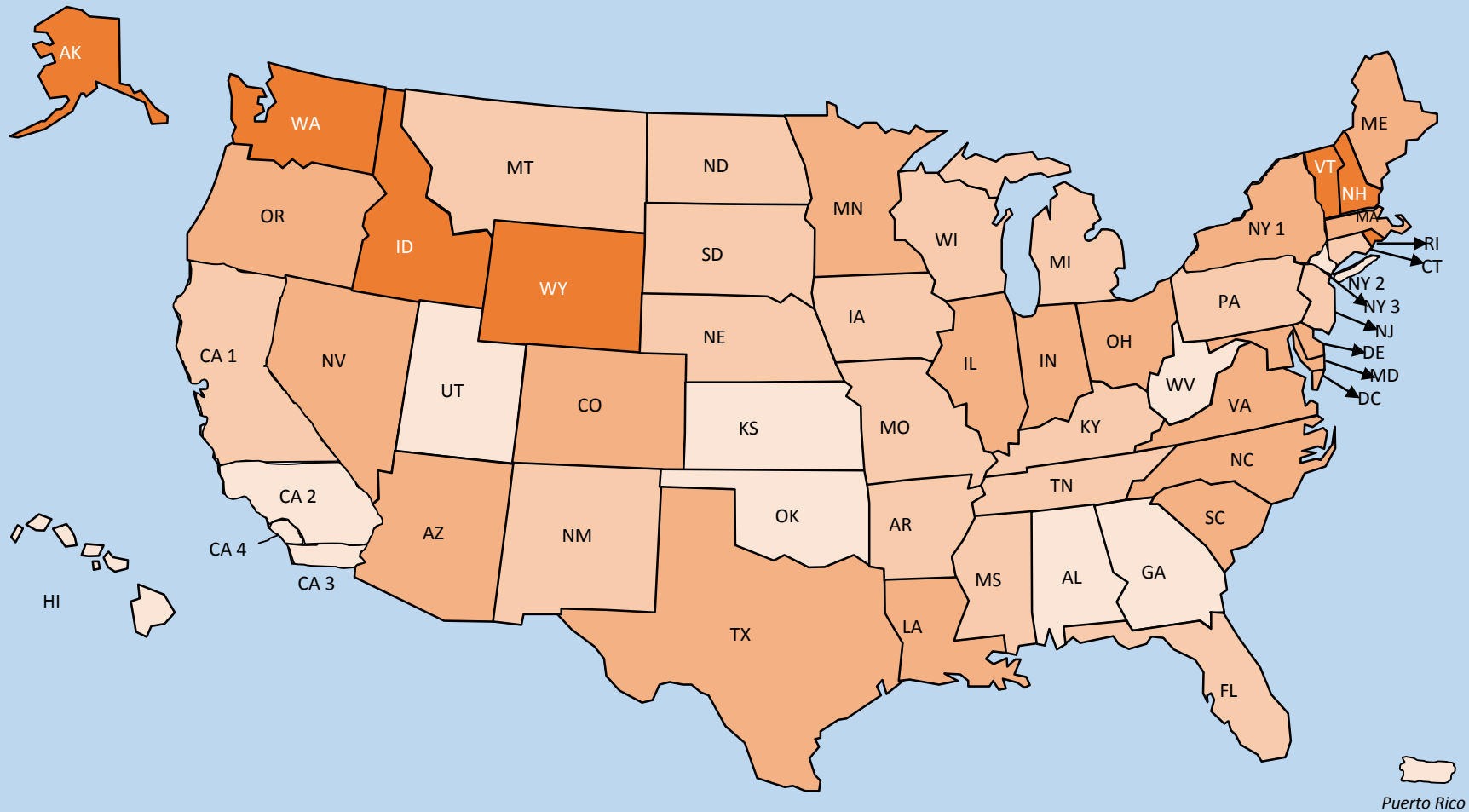

Difficulty in Obtaining a Child/Adolescent Psychiatry Appointment/Consultation in a Timely Manner



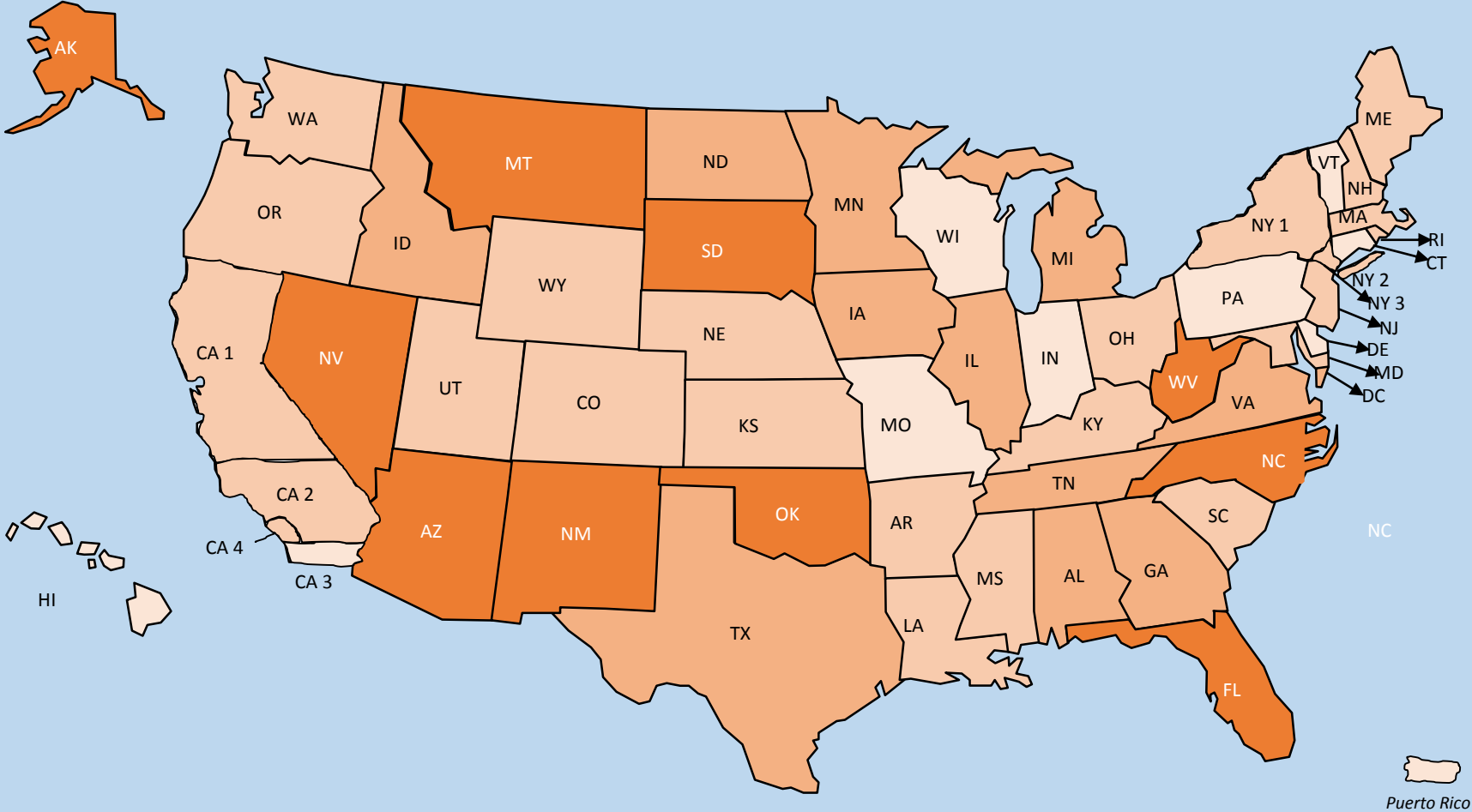
