



# IV. TITLE XIX (MEDICAID) AND FEDERALLY LEGISLATED TITLE XXI MEDICAID / SCHIP ELIGIBILITY FOR UNINSURED CHILDREN UNDER AGE 19, 1998 ESTIMATES

Analysis of the 1994 - 1997 March Current Population Surveys and 1998 Census Bureau projections of child population revealed an estimated 21K uninsured children under age 19, of whom 3.3K\* are unenrolled Medicaid eligibles, 7.7K are federally legislated Title XXI/SCHIP eligibles~. Full implementation of and maximum enrollment into both Title XIX and Title XXI programs would reduce Alaska's uninsured child population to 10.4K, or 5.0% of the state's 206K children under age 19.



### A. Title XIX Medicaid Eligibility and Expansions [44]

By federal mandate, all states must cover pregnant women and children to age 6 to 133% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) and children through age 14 up to 100% FPL, as of October 1, 1997.

In addition, 1996 federal welfare legislation requires states to use the AFDC income eligibility levels in effect as of July 16, 1996 to determine Medicaid eligibility. This establishes a state specific minimum eligibility level for poor children ages 15 through 18.

Alaska expanded its Title XIX Medicaid program to 133% through age 14. The Medically Needy [34] were not covered in 1997. As of June 10, 1998, Alaska had not submitted a proposal for a Section 1115 Waiver.

### B. Title XXI SCHIP/Medicaid Program Eligibility:

Alaska has not submitted a TitleXXI/SCHIP plan. Federally legislated maximum Title XXI SCHIP/Medicaid program eligibility for Alaska is 200% FPL for all infants and children through age 18. As of June 26, 1998, 42 states and the District of Columbia submitted their Title XXI/SCHIP plans and HCFA approved 22 of the submitted plans.
